

Attendance Policy- CSBT Campus.





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1. Introduction

At CSBT Campus, we recognize the critical importance of regular attendance in achieving academic success. Consistent attendance fosters a disciplined learning environment and ensures that students receive the full benefit of the educational programs offered. This attendance policy report outlines the expectations, procedures, and consequences related to student attendance at CSBT Campus, aiming to promote a culture of responsibility and commitment among students.

2. Attendance Expectations

Regular attendance is mandatory for all students enrolled in courses at CSBT Campus. Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes, seminars, and any other instructional sessions. This policy applies to all programs and courses offered by CSBT Campus, regardless of delivery method (in-person, online, or hybrid).

2.1. Importance of Attendance

3. Attendance Recording

Instructors are responsible for maintaining accurate attendance records for their classes. Attendance will be recorded at the beginning of each class session. For online courses, attendance may be tracked through participation in scheduled live sessions or timely completion of assigned tasks.

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3.1. Methods of Recording Attendance

- In-Person Classes: Instructors will take attendance manually or use electronic systems at the start of each class.
- Online Classes: Attendance can be tracked through virtual learning platforms, where participation in live sessions, submission of assignments, and engagement in online discussions are monitored.
- Hybrid Classes: Attendance for hybrid classes will be recorded based on both in-person and online participation.

4. Absences

CSBT Campus recognizes that students may occasionally need to miss classes due to legitimate reasons. Absences are categorized as either excused or unexcused, with different implications for each.

4.1. Excused Absences

Excused absences are granted for valid reasons, including but not limited to:

4.2. Unexcused Absences

5. Attendance Requirements and Consequences
